Annual General Meeting for 2022

Minutes

1. Welcome and Introduction:

The meeting began with welcome from the president, Graham Truscott, who chaired the meeting. He extended a special welcome to Tom Magill (Field Development Officer, Generate Services/Scripture Union (SU) and noted that the required quorum of 5 members had been met. Rev John Costin, representative of the Armidale Minister's Fellowship, opened the meeting with prayer and Kevin Tadman led a song.

2. Confirmation of Minutes of AGM, 10 November, 2021:

Minutes of the 2021 AGM were unanimously approved by the members of the association.

3. Business arising from minutes:

SRE at Minimbah Primary School

Peter Clark stated that he had contact with Minimbah School in April or June about the Quizzworx visit. He will try and speak with them again. He thinks they may go to PLC for a weekly scripture lesson. Peter to check with Dixie. Some Minimbah students attend Wyldlife on Monday afternoons. Graham stated that our intention is to have SRE at Minimbah.

Peter is hoping to get SRE up and running at Minimbah and at Chandler Public School. Graham has met with Rev Tim Stevens and Rev Andrew Campbell at Guyra regarding SRE commencing at Guyra Central School.

 Online registration for SRE to make it easier for parents to enrol their children

Tom Magill stated that there has been an ongoing discussion between the Inter-school Commission on Religious Education in Schools (ICCOREIS) and Department of Education & Training (DET). DET have been trialling online enrolment and it is hoped it will be released to all schools in time for the Parliamentary celebration of SRE in November. It will likely be on the form from 2023, but will not be mandatory. Graham commented that they do accept online registrations at Armidale Secondary College (ASC) and hopefully this will become part of the enrolment process. Primary schools may also go online. ASC principal Bree Harvey-Bice suggested AYF write a letter to be included with the Participation form and that has been done. Once online, the meeting considered how AYF could maintain that letter, and it was suggested that AYF ask the school to put a link across to the AYF website. This would put a spotlight on our website. It was noted that Kathy Ewers is planning to help re-generate our website.

 Requirement for AYF to have a license to use songs in the AGM and annual Commissioning

St Peter's has graciously allowed AYF to use their song license and hall so AYF does not need its own license.

4. Reports for 2021-22:

4.1 President's Report - Graham Truscott

Graham spoke to his report.

Armidale Youth Futures President's Report - 2021/22

On behalf of the AYF Management Committee it is with very sincere thanks that I present this President's report for 2021/22 to our churches, supporters and donors. At last, we have been largely freed from the restrictions of COVID and we are once again able to teach the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ through Christian Special Religious Education (SRE).

Generous church support

All the churches in the Armidale Ministers Fellowship have continued their generous support financially and, even more importantly, prayerfully for our team and students. Our supporting churches include:

All churches belonging to the Armidale Ministers' Fellowship have cross-authorised the SRE curricula:

- Primary: Connect (Years K-6)
- Secondary: Think Faith (Years 7-10) and Jesus the Game Changer and NUA Film Series -

Fresh Perspective On Faith (Years 11-12). Our AYF Mission has been expanded:

To promote the good news of Jesus through Christian SRE in all Armidale Primary Schools and Armidale Secondary College for the spiritual wellbeing of students.

Primary School SRE

Primary School SRE has previously been well managed and administered by voluntary coordinators Lynda Wysel and Peta Bale, with overall assistance from Janine Lewers. However, with Janine leaving Armidale in 2021 and the ever-increasing bureaucratic complexity and regulation of SRE, AYF was requested to take on the responsibility of Primary School SRE, with the blessing of the Armidale Minister's Fellowship. With the Lord's guidance we have employed Peter Clark in a new two-day per week Primary School SRE Church Coordinator role. Peter now coordinates all Primary School SRE liaison, classes, volunteer teachers, and teacher training. Also, he teaches some SRE classes and covers SRE teacher casual vacancies. With this new role we hope we will not miss any class opportunities to teach the Gospel to our children in the Primary schools.

We are teaching Christian SRE in Armidale City Public, Ben Venue, Drummond, Kelly's Plains, Martins Gully, Newling and Sandon Primary Schools.

AYF is now fully responsible for all Christian SRE from Kindy to Year 12. This provides new opportunities for tighter integration of Primary and Secondary SRE with better transition from Primary Year 6 into Secondary Year 7, maximising SRE student retention in that transition.

Secondary School SRE

2022 saw a return to normality in Armidale Secondary College following the massive disruption of COVID. Matt Mulready returned to his own staff-room desk, clearly regarded as a highly valued "member of staff" within the school community. SRE timetabling has enabled Years 7 – 10 to run smoothly. Years 11 and 12 have enjoyed SRE seminars each Term in school time. Matt was also approved to run an Easter Egg guessing competition with each year class and invited to present the Christian view of Easter at full assembly. Unfortunately, widespread COVID prevented that assembly this year. Relieving Principal Bree Harvey-Bice was very receptive to Matt's ideas and asked to sit-in on his SRE classes, reporting very favourably on Matt, his teaching and his "fit" in the school. Bree also suggested AYF provide a covering letter of invitation to parents enrolling their children into ASC, and that Matt run a special Christmas service in the newly constructed ASC auditorium at the end of the year. The letter has gone out with on the reverse side of all SRE Participation Forms. The Christmas service is in the planning stages. Thanks to the Lord we now hold a special place in ASC, a beacon of hope and purpose for both students and staff.

BOOST

BOOST (Inter-School Christian Fellowship or ISCF) finally resumed its lunchtime slot, including all class levels meeting together in 2022. Our students continued their own leadership of BOOST, underscoring the great value of 8 young student leaders attending the Scripture Union Leadership Conference in July 2021. With Matt's strong encouragement and linkage with Armidale City Church, St Mark's and St Peter's Youth Groups, 11 students have attended the week-long Leadership Conference held in Tamworth in July 2022, again with 50% sponsorship from AYF. The Conference has further developed their faith and trust in Jesus, and their skills for this ministry.

Blessings to our schools

AYF is always looking for ways to be a blessing to all our schools and to open the Gospel to all students. In this light, the KICK-OFF event presented by Word of Life Ministries and arranged by Matt was once again a huge hit with the kids. May 2022 saw 80 Primary and 90 Secondary students delight in the huge blow-up obstacle courses and hear the Gospel proclaimed at the end of both the Primary and Secondary sessions. Many good things have come out of KICK-OFF and continue happening, including students boldly inviting friends, connections between school and church, connections with parents over a free BBQ, 10 high school students accepting Jesus as saviour and 10 recommitting their lives to Jesus, 28 Bibles & 80 Testaments given out by Gideons, and much more.

Also, in June 2022 Peter arranged the Christian puppet show, Quiz Worx, for all our Primary Schools, clearly presenting the story of Jesus to all the children. The children delighted in seeing such a joyfully presented show with a very clear Gospel message.

Commissioning Service

Our annual Commissioning Service for Christian teaching in public schools was again hosted by St Peter's in February 2022 for all our Primary and Secondary SRE teachers and volunteers. We also sought to bless our mission partners: Young Life with their school chaplains, Gideons International in Australia and Scripture Union/Generate Ministries. We are all working together to reach our young people with the saving grace of our Lord Jesus. Even with COVID restrictions we were delighted to see over 70 supporters share a BBQ dinner and pray for our

mission into the public schools, sharing the vision of spreading God's Word to our young people.

Pray for Schools and AYF Prayer Breakfasts

Dedicated supporters from AYF, Young Life, Gideons and our Armidale churches gathered monthly to pray for all our Christian outreach into our schools, arranged by Sue Gooley, seeking the power of the Holy Spirit in transforming young lives.

AYF also brought together supporters each Semester to share pancakes and prayer for all our work in the schools, arranged by David Freeman.

AYF Fundraising

210 lively supporters shared our annual AYF Dinner in April 2022, excitedly bidding on the many Silent Auction, On-Line and Live Auction items and artworks so generously donated by supporters and the Armidale business community. The dinner raised \$28,000 towards the \$130,000 annual budget and proclaimed the vital importance of Building on the Rock of Jesus in our schools and the lives of our children in an ever changing and challenging world.

Our Monster Spring Garage Sale, late though it was in November 2021, saw \$8,900 raised.

Richard Lee ran a Gideons International stand in both events and was delighted with the number of Bibles and texts handed out.

Our children - the future of our churches

It just can't be emphasised enough how vital Christian SRE is in our schools. There are some 450 Primary children and about 200 Secondary students taking SRE – the equivalent of about 10 average Armidale churches! And most SRE students do not attend our regular churches. In a rapidly changing and challenging world these children desperately need to learn the love, mercy, grace and direction of our Lord Jesus Christ in their lives – the rock on which to build their future. It is these very children who will form the greater part of the church in the next generation. They will be the ones sitting in your pews! This is our mission field in our own town.

So, we pray that all our churches and supporters continue to support AYF with their prayers and donations. We will need to raise an additional \$33,000 each year to fund our Primary Coordinator, but we are very confident of your love and support for this vital mission.

Primary School SRE Church Coordinator Report

New Role

2022 started off with the new SRE Coordinator role. This has been a steep learning curve for me, finding out all the ins and outs of the position.

Schools

SRE is currently being delivered in all Armidale public schools. While some contact has been made with Minimbah we have not been invited to provide classes there yet. This is something that I am hoping to revisit next year.

Over the 7 public schools, there is approximately 450 Enrolled students in primary SRE across all of the

schools. We also have just over 20 teachers and helpers in these classes.

Curriculum

This year the students have been working through Cycle C of the Connect program. In Term 1 and 2, the students looked at how God is the king and calls for people to live under His leadership.

In Term 3, the curriculum focussed on showing that Jesus is the King, and the signs that point to who He is in John Gospel.

Term 4 looks at who Christians are and how to live as a child of God.

Kinder has also been exploring with God, finding out more about who God and Jesus are. A couple of the year 6 classes have been looking at the Big Questions curriculum, exploring the different aspects of Christianity.

Events

Early in the year, we hosted the Word of Life Team, who provided a fun filled evening for students in years 3 - 4. The Jnr Kick Off event was attended by approximately 80 students, all of whom were from the different schools. All who attended were told the good news through the wordless book. This has been a well remembered event for all the classes I have taken.

Each school was also visited by a team from Quiz Worx, an organisation who provides school and church visits. All the students loved having the team come around to hear why Jesus makes all the difference in the world. I also received lots of good remarks from the teachers about the visit.

Training

I was pleased to be able to attend SU Australia's conference this year as part of Generate. I was able to meet many colleagues and meet up with other coordinators from around Australia.

While at the conference I was also able attend some training to help me further in my role as a teacher. This training was useful to pass on to the teachers at our quarterly seminars.

Future Plans

Next year, my plans are to continue building up good relationships with the schools and also to continue to build up our team. We have a few new volunteers who are willing to step up and join the team.

- For the advocacy of Generate staff with the NSW Department of Education to enable the possibility of SRE exemptions


SRE Organisation and Curricula

In God's kindness SRE continues to be embedded in the life of ASC. In Years 7-10 SRE classes are timetabled for 60 minutes each fortnight and in Years 11-12 students are offered one SRE seminar each term.

Once again, the *Think Faith* SRE curriculum, produced by CEP (Christian Education Publications), has provided a strong biblical framework for students to grow their understanding of God and the Christian worldview. Year 11-12 SRE students have also benefited from the *Jesus the Game Changer* curriculum, produced by Olive Tree Media, in addition to the *NUA Film Series*, produced by Scripture Union Ireland. The SRE curricula are authorised by the Armidale Anglican Diocese and crossauthorised by all SRE providers partnering with AYF. SRE Enrolment

Transitioning students from Year 6 into 7 SRE continues to be integral to maintaining SRE numbers at ASC. Unfortunately, there were some challenges in 2021 which resulted in a significant drop in Year 7 numbers. Firstly, 2021 COVID restrictions prevented me from visiting Primary SRE classes to connect with incoming students. Secondly, the enrolment process at ASC was disrupted with the SRE Participation Letter being omitted from enrolment packs. Student numbers across Years 8-10 have tracked normally.



In 2022 I have enjoyed being able to visit Primary SRE classes once again to make connections with students. It was a highlight inviting Primary students to the Jnr KICK OFF event and seeing over 80 smiling, energetic faces who heard a clear gospel message and built rapport with SRE teachers.

BOOST

The easing of covid restrictions in Term 1 enabled BOOST to gather altogether for the first time in nearly a year. It has been a real joy seeing students across all year-groups growing faith together each week. The student leaders have also met weekly to plan, prepare and pray.

Our first event, BIG Arvo Tea at the Arboretum, was a special welcome for Year 7. It was exciting to have 4 new students along.

Matt spoke to his report. He is enjoying working with Peter – especially regarding the connection between primary and secondary SRE. He mentioned the NUA film series from SU Ireland which he is using with Year 11 and 12 students.

4.3 Treasurer's Report - Rob McClenaghan

See attached FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2022

Rob was unable to attend but Graham Truscott spoke to the financial reports Rob had prepared, which were tabled at the meeting. Gifts and donations are down and the committee needs to encourage supporters to increase donations as this is 70% of income. Dinner income was down. AYF employed Peter Clark part-time for 2-days per week from January this year, and this coming year we will need to employ him for the full 12 months, requiring an additional \$30,000 to be raised. The Balance Sheet shows we are in a strong and resilient position with a Net Asset of \$168,594.

5. Questions to the Board

David Freeman asked a question about other assets on the Balance Sheet – Graham Truscott responded that it is GST owing to us that hasn't been received. Sharyn Holmes asked why we are expecting GST. Graham Truscott replied that we pay GST and need to claim it back from the Australian Taxation Office.

Ben Boland asked whether we need to be in such a solid a position? Shouldn't we share our finances with other organisations who need it?

Graham Truscott responded that we must be careful that we expend our money according to our objects. That's why we want to be a blessing to our schools. Perhaps we can send more kids on camps with this money? Also we are working to assist SRE starting in surrounding schools. Graham invited anyone with good ideas to please pass them on.

Matt Mulready asked whether there is scope for providing SRE at Uralla Central School. Graham Truscott and Peter Clark responded that they already have SRE operating fortnightly in their primary school. Matt Mulready said that he had been referring to Secondary SRE and stated that this certainly fits with our vision statement and is one avenue to explore. A secondary SRE teacher could be employed at Uralla Central in consultation with the community. This is also a possibility at Guyra Central School.

Richard Lee asked whether Peter and Matt have enough hours to do their roles? Matt is full time. Peter replied - yes — at this stage as he does one day teaching and one day of administration per week.

Graham Truscott asked Matt Mulready to speak about the Christmas service in new ASC auditorium. Matt had put forward a plan to Principal Bree Harvey-Bice and she is happy to go ahead. The date is booked for Friday of Week 7 (Nov 25th). SRE students will go as well as all other students who return a permission note. Richard Lee asked whether we could hand out Gideon bibles there. Emmaus church suggested that we invite year 6 to attend the service. This is a possibility for future years.

David Freeman asked a question about income and expenditure, noting AYF expends \$87,966 to Generate Services for teacher/coordinator employment. How much will that be for a calendar year? We will potentially have a \$20k deficit for next year, unless we increase our fundraising/income.

David Freeman commented that the Kick Off event at ASC was very positive, especially for chatting with parents.

6. Election of Management Committee members

The following nominations were received by the secretary 7 days prior to the AGM:

- President Graham Truscott
- Vice-President Dave Freeman

- Secretary Philip Ward

- Ordinary Members Julie Cook, Kathy Ewers, Nikki Lomath
- It was mentioned that we are looking for a future President to begin in 12 months.

Graham Truscott vacated the chair and Rob Dewhurst assumed the chair, and conducted the elections for the above positions, noting that written nominations had been received prior to the AGM. Rob Dewhurst moved that all nominations be accepted and Lynda Wysel seconded the motion. Those noted above were duly elected as the AYF Management Committee for 2023. Graham Truscott resumed the chair for the reminder of the meeting.

7. General business

Constitution update

Graham Truscott reminded the meeting that AYF has accepted as its Constitution the Model Rules incorporated bodies established by NSW Fair Trading, and in doing so has agreed to accept all changes to those Model Rules. He advised that Fair Trading has updated its Model Rules and so the AYF Constitution has automatically been updated to reflect those new Model Rules. Issues to note are:

- The AYF Constitution requires that those who wish to be members of AYF must sign the Statement of Faith, and the new Constitution also includes this requirement.
- ii. New rule 34 members cannot cast votes by proxy, so the proxy form no longer required.
- iii. New rule 35 provides no opportunity for proxy voting.

The meeting noted the change of AYF Constitution according to its adoption of the NSW Fair trading Model Rules, plus the AYF requirement for inclusion of the membership requirement to sign the Statement of Faith.

Kevin Tadman asked about the use of the new Model Rules for Christian organisations. Graham advised he could not see anything in the NSW Fair Trading advice that suggests AYF could not continue to have its Statement of Faith included in its Constitution.

Rob Dewhurst commented that Matt and Peter are actually employed by Generate and not AYF.

Tom Magill noted that Generate's chaplains are technically employed as ministers of religion and they represent the churches of the area.

Tom Magill commented that it was encouraging for him to be here. He is the Area Manager for Generate North West NSW which is now part of SU Australia. There will be a new SU camp in December called Gent's camp for young men in years 7,8,9,10. This camp will help show them what being a Christian man looks like. North West is having their camp at Lake Keepit in the 2nd week of December. Tom advised that the SU Schools Ministry Convention had 800 attendees mainly from East Coast of Australia. At the conference, Length of Service awards were handed out. Matt Mulready was eligible for an award for his 13 years of service but couldn't be at the conference, so Tom presented him with his certificate at the meeting.

Graham thanked all who attended and after a song led by Kevin Tadman, Julie Cook closed in prayer. The meeting was followed by supper.

Notes to and Forming Part of the Financial Statements

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies / Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared for use by Armidale Youth Futures Incorporated. It has been prepared in order to assist the Management Committee and members to understand the financial performance of the organisation. The financial report is also prepared to meet the requirements of the *Charitable Fundraising Authority Conditions*.

Unless otherwise stated below, the financial report has been prepared on a cash basis, based on historic costs.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Revenue Recognition

Revenue in the form of gifts, donations, fundraising, bank interest and other income have been recognised upon receipt.

(b) Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on a cash basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

2. Use of Surpluses from Fundraising Appeals

Surpluses generated from fundraising appeals were used towards the organisation's mission of establishing, maintaining and growing Christian education at Armidale Secondary College and Armidale Primary Schools.

3. Remuneration of Officers

No member of the Management Committee nor Chairman received remuneration from the organisation. The running of the organisation relies on the generous effort of unremunerated volunteers.
